From Siem Reap to Phnom Kulen, we will meet Cambodia's people and see its landscapes, culminating in a dawn trip to the world's largest religious structure at Angkor Wat.



TRIP ESSENTIALS

- Passport and visa – you need a passport valid through January 2017. We will arrange the Cambodia visa.
- Inoculations – Tabor's Health Center arranges for needed immunizations, at cost.
- Please travel light – one duffel bag or suitcase only – 3 shirts, 1 trousers, 2 pair shorts, walking shoes and sandals, health items, 5 sets underwear and socks, bug spray, sunglasses.
- Accommodations – we will stay at safe hotels and eat in clean conditions in Siem Reap at the start and end of the trip. Our home stay will be in simple bungalow-style rooms, with floor mats and thin inflatable mattresses, comparable to those of local people.
- Adjustment – traveling in a new part of the world requires flexibility, a sense of adventure, and stamina. Service requires a commitment to working together and learning as a group, giving up the comforts of home, and enjoying the reward of making life better for others at a far-away place on the planet.
- Service – Our service program is to build a bridge for a needy commune of five villages 30 miles from Siem Reap. We will live in the village for six days, teach English in the local school and learn about local life.

TRIP COST

- \$3000 – trip cost including round-trip plane ticket from Boston to Siem Reap, visas, meals and living quarters, and local transportation and ticketing fees.
- Maximum: 20 students, 5 faculty
- \$150 – approximate immunizations
- \$300 – recommended spending money
- Health insurance overseas coverage needs to be certified by each student.
- In the event of trip cancelation due to epidemic or unsafe conditions, every effort will be made to secure refunds from trip and ticket providers, but no guarantee is made to cover this cost.
- Some scholarship aid is available
- Participation – School rules apply on this trip. Students must be physically able to meet the trip requirements, and must be in good academic and disciplinary standing to participate.
